**PROFESSOR HARRY REICHER OF TOURO LAW SCHOOL TO SPEAK**

The Suffolk Center on the Holocaust, Diversity & Human Understanding, Inc. is hosting presentations by Prof. Harry Reicher in furtherance of Holocaust remembrance. At 9:30 am he will be speaking about Law Under the Nazis, examining the perversion of the country's legal system, in both its legislative as well as judicial aspects, and the conversion of both into savage instruments designed to discriminate against, ostracize, dehumanize, and ultimately eliminate, certain classes of people, first and foremost Jews. That will be followed at 11 am by a talk on the Nuremberg Trials and Their Abiding Impact on the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Prof. Reicher will discuss bringing Nazi-era perpetrators to justice along with bringing other major human rights violators to justice, such as Saddam Hussein and Slobodan Milosevic.

Harry Reicher is Professor of Law and Scholar-in-Residence at Touro Law School's Institute for Holocaust Law and International Human Rights. Prof. Reicher was born in Prague, emigrated to Australia where he became an expert on international law, and continued his education at Harvard Law School. He has taught at the University of Pennsylvania School of Law and served on the United States Holocaust Memorial Council.
