

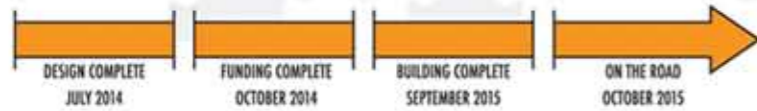
ROAD MAP, where will it go?

The Liberty Express will travel throughout Long Island to serve the students of the region! Our exhibits will emphasize connections to people and places on Long Island.

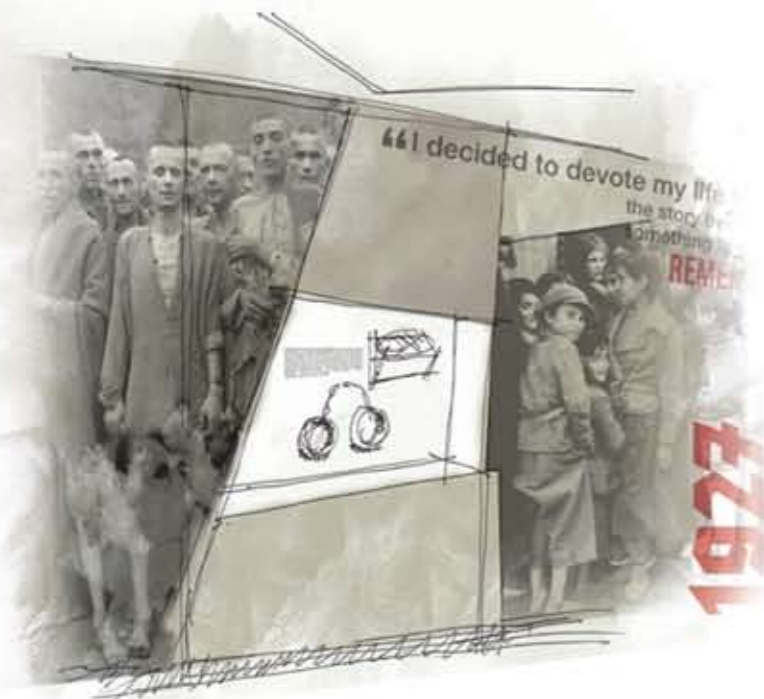


WHEN will it open?

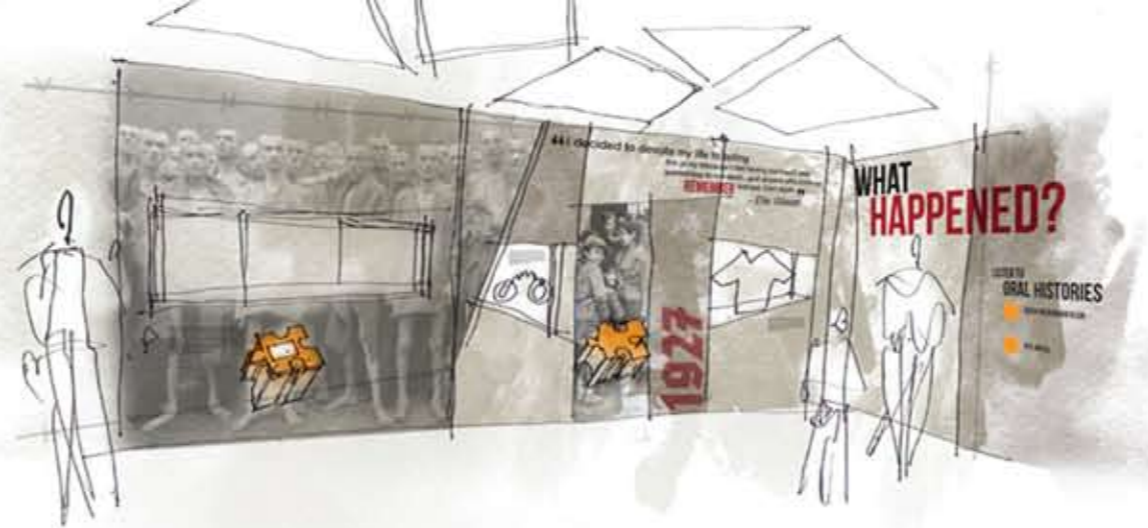

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The SUFFOLK CENTER ON THE HOLOCAUST, DIVERSITY & HUMAN UNDERSTANDING, INC. (CHDHU) is a 501 (c)(3) not-for-profit incorporated in 2003. It currently manages a permanent exhibit installation on the campus of Suffolk County Community College, and offers programs and exhibits at various locations. CHDHU's mission is to educate the community about historical events, and to promote cultural understanding and respect for human dignity.

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WHAT is it?

Liberty Express, a mobile museum, is an exciting new immersive museum experience intended for Long Island secondary school students and as a model for communities everywhere. The mobile museum will be designed to teach historical lessons from slavery and the Holocaust, and to inspire teens to become responsible members of the community.



AUTHENTIC ARTIFACTS

The exhibitions will showcase **historical objects** which will allow students to not only learn about the past but to see real, compelling evidence of our history.

ONE MUSEUM: TWO STORIES

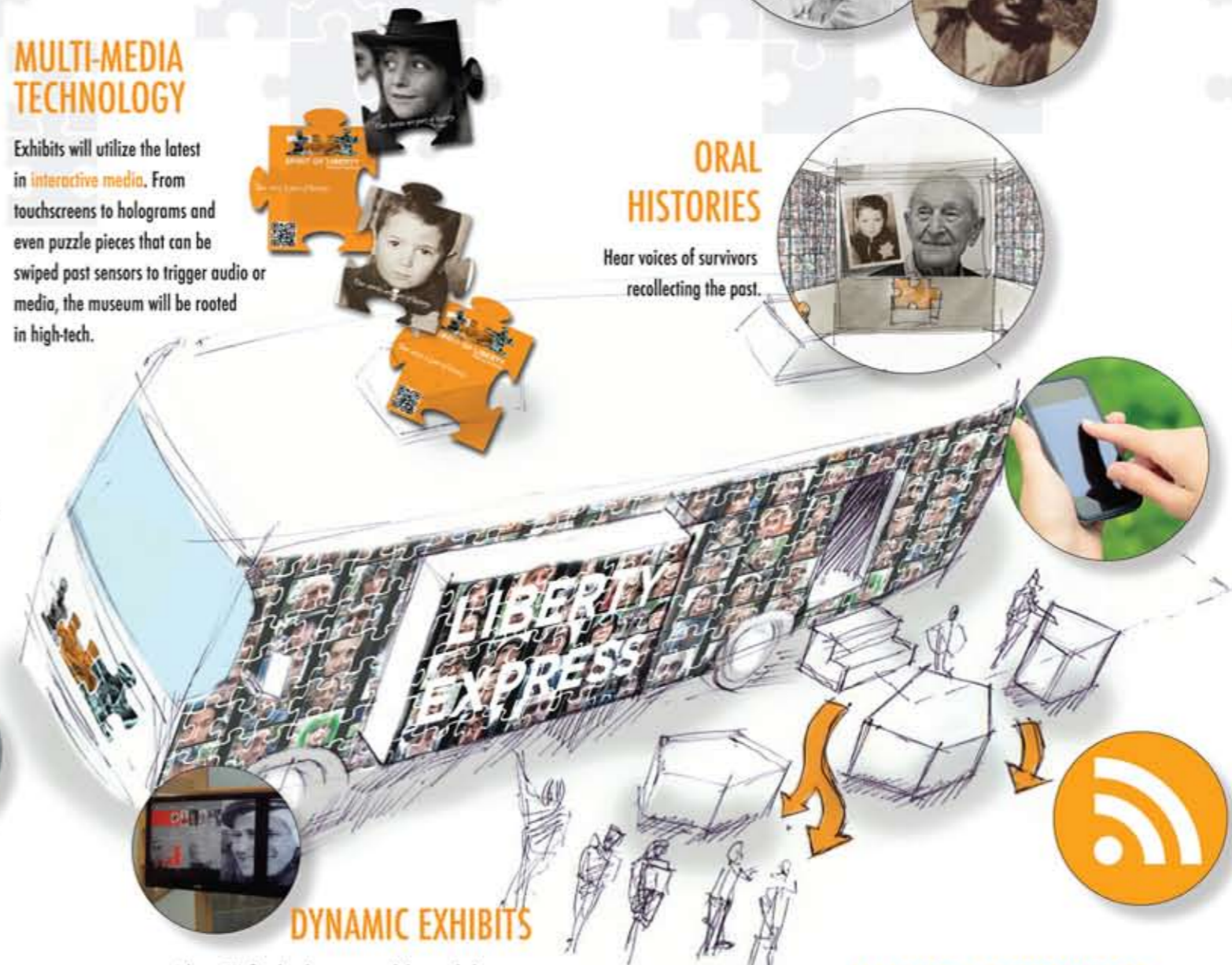
Liberty Express is a museum that will include interactive multi-media, graphics and objects that can be changed out to showcase different exhibitions at different times of the year. The curriculum will alternate to allow for presentations on the Holocaust or on slavery.

PUTTING THE PIECES TOGETHER.

Liberty Express is planned as a museum that will enable teens to learn about historic events and develop a connection with content through powerful exhibit experiences. As guests of the museum, students will internalize important lessons that teach values of diversity and coexistence. Through exhibits that offer the opportunity to record their own experiences and to relate history to the present, students will learn to defuse the power of propaganda and be encouraged to take action.

MULTI-MEDIA TECHNOLOGY

Exhibits will utilize the latest in **interactive media**. From touchscreens to holograms and even puzzle pieces that can be swiped past sensors to trigger audio or media, the museum will be rooted in high-tech.



DYNAMIC EXHIBITS

A large RV, fitted with museum exhibits, including touchscreen interactives, audio with voices from the past, artifacts elegantly displayed, powerful photographs, and many hands-on opportunities will take to the road to make a compelling museum experience accessible to every middle and high school student in the region.
